## Is Your House In Order?

eeping on track with our annual duties, all chapters should have completed their Florida Department of State Not-For-Profit Corporation Annual Report, and submitted IRS form 990. Failure to file either would result in the administrative dissolution of your chapter and it will no longer be recognized as an active corporation.

Nashville has been requesting that all chapters to go into e-biz and record the fact that these taxes and forms have been filed, along with another related item. Thus we get to the e-mail message I sent out in May.

#### Use E-Biz

Historically chapters have always been asked to send copies of their 990 filings to Nashville. Society has now given us the ability to update this information on e-biz ourselves. To access ebiz and mark this information, find the "Financial Filings" link on your chapter's roster page.

More specifically:

# 1. Go to <a href="https://ebiz.barbershop.org/ebusiness">https://ebiz.barbershop.org/ebusiness</a>

2. Under the "My Memberships" select "My Chapters" then click your chapter's name in the resulting list. 3. At the top of the roster you will see a series of links; one will say "Financial Filings". *Click it.* 

I have been told by Nashville that the Chapter President, Chapter Treasurer, and Chapter Secretary all have access to this interface. If you can't find this interface, contact me so I can help you. There is a possibility that you don't have your chapter leaders listing in e-biz up to date. From the "Financial Filings" page, you should see a page with three "categories" of information. There's a separate interface for each:

990 Filings Financial Review State Incorporation Filings

The "990 Filings" is where you need to record the fact that you've filed your taxes. Select your tax year (i.e. 2009) in the Fiscal Year drop-down, enter the date the taxes were sent, and click Add. If you have already sent the hard copy to Nashville, this may already be filled in for you.

The "Financial Review" category is a way to tell Nashville that you've done a review of your chapter's books. You are

doing this regularly, right? This is an informal thing, I'm not talking about a formal financial

"audit". One suggestion I've heard is to find a treasurer from a nearby chapter, meet up for an afternoon and inspect each other's previous year's books.

It's always good to have another set of eyes looking at stuff like this and that's the point of the review. Anyway, similar to the 990 Filings category, select the fiscal year, enter the date

the review was done, and click Add. Similar to the tax filing, if you've sent evidence of such reviews to Nashville, then they should have added a record here for you already.

# Incorporation Filings

The "State Incorporation Filings" category is how you tell Nashville that you've been diligent with keeping your incorporation status current. This one everyone will definitely need to fill in. In this case the "Fiscal Year" will be the year corresponding to the report interval which odds are should be 2010. The Date Filed is when you sent the report and "Expires" should be filled in

with the date of your next incorporation anniversary (this is the date when the next Annual Report is due). Select FL for the State and click Add.


#### It's YOUR HOD

# Society Board Meeting Report

pring has sprung, district conventions and prelims are in progress and the society board completed its spring planning meeting on Saturday, March 27, 2010. All members of the board were in attendance as were appropriate members of the harmony society staff and several distinguished guests. Here are some of the items I thought were of particular interest from our meeting.

2-Year Rotation?

The board received an update from **Ed Watson**, CEO, on the current Contest and Judging Committee discussion regarding the proposed 2-year chorus rotation. This proposal would establish a year and a half between the prelim

convention and the actual competition so there would be two distinct contest tracks, effectively doubling the number of choruses which would be able to participate on the international stage. The current effort to obtain input from the membership on this topic is the survey and corresponding blog on the BHS website. While the current results indicate a fairly strong majority generally favor the proposal, there are still active discussions, especially among the district presidents, about how the change might affect participation at the district conventions.

Task Force Updates

The board received updates from the Chairs of the four mini-task forces which have been formed as adjuncts of the Membership Growth Task Force (MGTF). The groups and their chairmen are as follows:

Delivery Methods Alan Lamson
New Chapters Alan Wile
External Focus Gary Parker
All Ages Shannon Elswick

It was interesting to note that the various groups, while having different charges and different members, have begun to identify some common themes and ideas. The groups are tasked with completing their work and making a final recommendation to the full board for presentation at the July meeting in *Philadelphia*. Watch for an update from MGTF Chairman **Noah Funderburg** in an upcoming edition of the Harmonizer.

**Skipp Kropp**, Chair of the *Carolinas District Task Force*, submitted a written report indicating the task force had successfully completed the charge as issued by the society

board. President **Biffle** read to the board an official correspondence to the members of the task force thanking them for their time and announcing that their work is now completed. The 17<sup>th</sup> district of the Barbershop Harmony Society is now authorized and officially recognized as such. It is anticipated that the new District will formally begin operations on or before July 1, 2010.

The board heard a report from the *Global Strategy Development Task Force* which is chaired by Connie Keil. A considerable amount of time and energy has gone

into working with the affiliate organizations to determine their thoughts and ideas about how to best relate to the society and those discussions are ongoing. The board acknowledged that membership continues to be job one but it is appropriate and important for the society board to have a strong voice (pardon the pun) in a cappella harmony throughout the world.

### Financial Report

Society Treasurer, **Jim Lee**, gave the financial report. The Audit for 2009 is progressing nicely and is largely completed at this point. There are no issues reported so

far which would likely result in any significant audit adjustments. The final sign off of the audit is expected to be sometime near the end of May. This is a very timely process and speaks well for our financial team and their accounting procedures. The balance sheet and income statement for FY 2010 year to date were reviewed. Financial performance for the first two months is nearly \$150,000 ahead of budget and over \$100,000 better than last year at the same time. With registrations being relative strong for Philly, we are also hoping to meet our budget expectations for the international convention.

CEO Ed Watson gave his report. As noted above, registrations for Philadelphia are running strong as compared to budget. Adam Scott has been hired to become the third music specialist on the society staff. This position was created by combining two part time positions. Ed reminded the board that 2010 is the cycle for a full leadership forum and the OT is working on a proposed funding scenario for the society and the 17 districts to share the cost. He wrapped up his report by describing two proposed programs

to get additional help to the chapters. One program, "Tag Team," will effectively put additional manpower into the field for chapter visitation. This new program will focus on recruitment, retention, planning, goal setting, education, creating fun, music, performance, and much more and will be available to chapters who want and need the help. Another program, "Four on the Road," will identify/create a quartet dedicated totally to represent BHS and travel into schools and communities throughout the society. This group might also be available for guest nights, chapter shows and other direct support opportunities. Stay tuned for details on these exciting programs.

The Annual Planning Cycle Review Committee presented its update and the board approved the AIMs for 2010 and 2011. Here are the specific numerical metrics:

#### AIM #1

Reverse the declining membership trend, return to positive growth, and increases the number of chapters.

- Increase the number of chapters with 12 or more members by 5 in 2010 and 10 in 2011
- Decrease the net loss of membership to 600 in 2010 and achieve positive net growth in 2011

#### AIM #2

Chapters enrich lives through singing in community service.

- Establish a baseline for the number of chapters reporting community service by the end of 2010 and increase that number by 5% by the end of 2011
- Develop a program to provide for meaningful reporting overall by chapters, get baseline data by the end of 2010, and get comparable data again by the end of 2011

#### In Conclusion

As I have noted in the past, these are merely some of the highlights of the meetings as opposed to a detailed description. Please feel free to let me know if you want more or less of this kind of information. I appreciate hearing from you when ever there is something on your mind which relates to the policies and/or governance of the barbershop harmony society. I continued to be humbled and honored to serve as your designated society board liaison.

If not before, I hope to see many of you in *Philly*. Until then, keep singing and keep smiling.

### Wise Guys Gift

For several years, we took the elderly mother of a friend of my wife to barbershop shows in *Jacksonville*. Cynthia loved the music as well as the comedy routines. But for the past few years, her increasing frailty prohibited her attendance.

On March 20, Cynthia, now living in *Riverside Presbyterian House* in *Jacksonville*, turned 100 years of age. When her daughter discussed birthday gifts with her, Cynthia mentioned that she would love to hear the barbershop quartet that sang about the squirrel running loose in the *Baptist Church* in *Mississippi*. Cynthia's daughter phoned my wife to ascertain the name of that quartet, and whether they still sing together. As luck would have it, I was together with a couple of members of that quartet the very next weekend, and

I related to them the story of their 100-year-old fan in a *Jacksonville* nursing home.

The quartet remembered by **Cynthia** is *Wise Guys*, one of Florida's most popular quartets for many years, during which time it has been Sunshine District Champion and also qualifier for International competition on several occasions. It has performed on chapter shows throughout North America. Most audiences never forget baritone **Brett Cleveland**'s solo performance on "*The Squirrel*..." which is undoubtedly their most-requested number.

So I asked Wise Guy's lead, Mark Schlinkert, if by any chance they might be performing in Northeast Florida during the third week of March, and might drop in to sing a song for Cynthia on or about her 100th birthday. "No way," replied Mark without pause. "We are going to put on a mini show for her entire nursing home as our birthday gift to her." But, I pointed out, these people aren't very well off. "It doesn't matter," Mark said. 'There is no cost involved." So, I gave him Cynthia's daughter's phone number and the next thing I heard was that the show was scheduled for 6 pm on March 18<sup>th</sup>, two days before her birthday what a great present she is receiving from some extraordinary singers.

People often ask me what is the magic that keeps me involved in barbershop singing all these years. I usually respond with the enjoyment of the music coupled with the camaraderie of my fellow singers. But the real answer, I believe, is the quality of human beings that belong to our hobby — people like the four members of *Wise Guys* who genuinely are more interested in the pleasure of each member of their audience than in personal gratification or monetary reward. I can proudly join with countless

### The Neil Plum Scholarship Fund

The *Charlotte County Chapter* Board of Directors voted to establish a scholarship award fund to be used for deserving students in *Charlotte County*. Although wholeheartedly supported, the question was how to fund such an operation without taking away from our chapter's finances, nor detracting from our financial support of the Society.

Our annual show was on March 20, 2010 at the *Charlotte County Events and Conference Center* and prior to the show, members were soliciting advertisements for our program book.

It was suggested that at the same time, we could also ask if our advertisers would like to contribute merchandise or provide items that could be chanced off at our show, with the income going into our scholarship fund. Many of our advertisers were more than willing to supply things that would support a scholarship fund.

In the lobby at our show, a table was set up with a separate box for each of the potential prizes that were offered. Persons who contributed a dollar (or dollars) could place their ticket(s) into the boxes for the prize they hoped to win. At the intermission of our show, each prize and the contributor was announced, then the ticket was drawn and the award given to the attendee who came forward with the matching ticket.

We are very happy to say, we raised over \$1000 toward our new *Neil Plum Scholarship Fund*. Neil has over 50 years with the Society, most of them as a chorus director, and he retired a little over a year ago but sings with the chorus, although he is still up there directing when needed.

**Neil** is a quartet member who has competed on the International level, and also possesses Gold as a member of the Senior Champions, *Saturday's Heroes*. As our Director Emeritus, the Board felt it only right to name our Fund after one who has contributed so much to our Society.





The quartets had the opportunity to sing in the various hospitality rooms on Saturday night without having to worry about attending the evaluations on Saturday night. Therefore, we are going to have the finalist quartet evaluations in Ocala on Sunday morning.

### New Evaluation Times

Regarding evaluations, attending an evaluation with the judges is the best way for a quartet (and chorus) to hear what the judges felt about your performance(s) and receive tips on what you can do to improve your performances. We encourage all of you to take advantage of the valuable things that the judges can offer you.

The cutoff for entering the fall contest in *Ocala* for quartets and choruses will be Friday, September 26th. The draw will be conducted on Saturday, September 27th and published on the Sunshine Net. Follow-up emails will be sent that same day to the contact person indicated on the CJ-20.

### Change Requests

Requests for changes in the draw must be received by me no later that Monday, Sepetember 29th. All requests will be considered. If the draw is changed due to requested changes, the revised draw will be published on





the **Sunshine** Net and emails to the contact individuals.

Quartet members, keep in mind that you may sing in more than one quartet for the District Championship. This does not apply to Seniors quartets, since we will be selecting the Sunshine District representative to the International Seniors competition in Las Vegas. However, a man may sing in a seniors quartet and a quartet entered into the district quartet contest

Before you make your entry into the contest on the Society website, make sure you have all the required song information gathered, as this is a requirement to complete your entry.



# Registration for Fall Convention 2010

e, your District Convention Registration Team, still find that there are many questions asked about the registration process for each district convention. We would hope that an experienced member in each chapter take the time and responsibility to instruct any new member on the various methods of registration and the terminology used in each, especially if that chapter is competing.

#### A New Form

There is a new registration form in this issue, and also on the district website, and there are some changes that we hope will clear up any misunderstandings from past forms. Any competing member must hold a valid registration and current society membership to compete onstage. That member can then register his wife, and guests for a full registration to all events; or, if they are not going to attend the whole convention, single event tickets may be purchased.

Students, under the age of 24 with valid student ID, can register for the Youth Package at \$20. Single event youth tickets go for \$10. Complete quartets may register on one form and list their guests on a separate sheet or form.

### Recordings

One video recording per chapter or quartet may be ordered; and remember, by society and union rules, only <u>one</u> copy is allowed per chapter or quartet.

#### 50 Year = Free

A 50 year member receives a free registration to conventions, and hopefully, the new district website will allow him to register online without making a payment. Don't forget, we have a list of 50 year members, so you can't pull any tricks!

### Web Site

This brings us to the new website; and hopefully, when it is up and running, registration will be a little more straightforward. Don't be put off by the request for a *Paypal* password. You don't need a Paypal account to use the website. Paypal is merely the conduit for the payment.
