

On Point improved their scores from the Harmony Foundation Youth Quartet Preliminary Contests, going from 26<sup>th</sup> place (68.1%) to 16<sup>th</sup> place (74.1%). THX did themselves proud again representing Sunshine. I thoroughly enjoyed the set and Alex, you and the boys should know that from my eyes and ears, you didn't leave anything behind. Great job!! There wasn't one District President that didn't come up to me and congratulate Sunshine. I thoroughly enjoyed their comments (on your behalf of course).

## DELINQUENT CHAPTER REQUIREMENTS AND UPCOMING HOD MEETING

Yeah, I know—more bugging us about stuff that needs to be done. What is this, a singing society or a paperwork society? Geeze!!

Anyway here we go:

Remember the last Sunburst and my article that reminded us all about the requirements that keep us legal? You know, state incorporations, taxes, ASCAP, BMI/SESAC—those things. Well here we are past the halfway point and I need to give you an update on those requirements.

### State Incorporations:

Really great job folks---All but one chapter has filed with the state for nonprofit status; however, only 16 of our chapters who have filed with the state remembered to update the chapter records with the society in the eBiz Section. I'm sure that will be corrected soon.

### Taxes, Taxes, Taxes:

Another annual housekeeping function regards filing your taxes. Based again on the financial records posted on the society ebiz page only 17 of our chapters have filed the chapter 990 for last year. Again, the tax documents may have been filed but the chapter records need to be updated.

### Financial Review

There is one other "business" type requirement that has been somewhat ignored, and that is the Financial Review. Thirteen, that's right, just 13 of our chapters have updated this requirement on eBiz, the remainder are delinquent in that requirement. And delinquency in any of the requirements puts the chapter in jeopardy of incurring penalties including disqualification from competition. You can check to see if your chapter is in this category by simply going to the chapter financial records on ebiz. If you have questions or need assistance, let me know.

### ASCAP

Let's start thinking about 2016 and your ASCAP payment. If your chapter had a performance where admission was charged, then you must pay ASCAP fees. The fee is \$241.00 **if your chapter**

**does not gross more than \$30,125.00** in ticket sales for ALL performance(s) during the year of 2016. When submitting your fees please fill out **SECTION A** of the ASCAP submittal form and mail it to me with a check made out to BHS for the minimum amount  **\$241.00**. This process applies to 95% of our chapters. Keep in mind the annual minimum fee is just that- an annual fee, not a per show fee.

If your Chapter grosses more than \$30,125.00 in ticket sales for ALL performance(s) during 2016, check the procedure at the Barbershop Harmony Society Website. The ASCAP form is to be completed to comply with the agreement between The Society and The American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP). You should submit this form to your District Secretary (me). My Address is:

Once again, checks should be written out to the "Barbershop Harmony Society" NOT ASCAP and need to be mailed directly to me for recording and processing; **DO NOT SEND ANY PAYMENTS DIRECTLY TO ASCAP**. Download the form and more information from the forms section of the Society web page.

**Upcoming HOD Meeting:** This is a reminder we have a House of Delegates meeting scheduled for Friday October 7<sup>th</sup>, 2016 at 2pm in Orlando during the Fall Convention. Please remember to have your Chapter Delegates who will be representing your chapter updated on the eBiz Section of the society's website. I will be sending the agenda to all the Delegates prior to the meeting so make sure this information is correct so you receive advanced notification.

Greetings from your SUN District Treasurer!

By now, ALL chapters should have filed their 990s with the IRS and sent a copy to Eric Dove in Nashville. His e-mail address is [edove@barbershop.org](mailto:edove@barbershop.org). For future reference, if you need help in filling out the forms, Eric has a set of instructions on the BHS e-biz website to guide you through it. As treasurer, you should have access to that portion of the website. The penalties can be stiff from the IRS. They have pulled the non-profit status on 4 of the chapters in the Sunshine District in the past 5 years. I'm not going to name names here, but the penalties can be severe.

In addition, as I covered at LeadAc, there is a form that the state of Florida requires if you do ANY fundraising as a non-profit. It's a DACS-10100, charitable organization registration through the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. It should cost you no more than \$125 to file. It asks quite a few questions, but you should have all the information available to you. It's especially necessary if you are going for some kind of local government grants as many cities, counties and the state of Florida are cracking down on lobbyists and want to make sure the money they give is going to the proper place. This puts you on a registered list that states you are a bona-fide non-profit corporation which should help you get grant money and other types of donations. Hopefully, you will receive this prior to the Fall Convention in Orlando. We have finished the budget early this year and hope to present it to the House of Delegates at the Fall convention for approval. We, as a district, are in fairly good financial shape considering the economy. I am trying very hard to keep us going for some time and wisely spend your money on things that benefit the chapters of the district. We, at the district level, have many of the

same problems the chapters have; namely cash flow. If you haven't done so already, I suggest you sign your chapter up for direct deposit of your dues checks from Nashville. They tell me the deposits will come monthly instead of a check coming to you quarterly.

I will be teaching the LeadAc classes next January and hope to change how we teach it based on the level of treasurers we have in the class. Many of the treasurers have been doing it for some time and there is no need to start from scratch. I look forward to meeting each of the treasurers at the classes next year.

The next step for the treasurers will be preparing the 2017 budget and analyzing how you did in 2016. If you have any questions, my e-mail is listed below. In an emergency, my cell phone is available at 561-301-6901.


Lastly, your district is looking at purchasing new risers for the first time in over 20 years. This way, we won't have to borrow risers from the chapters for conventions. If your chapter can afford it, or a member can afford a donation, the District will appreciate it immensely. We need a total of 11 sections of risers totaling around \$15,000 for the entire set. We have already received \$1,100, have verbal commitments for 2 more sections, and I believe the district can afford at least 4 sections. If you can help, please mark your checks for riser donations and send it to the address below. We are looking at ordering the new risers late next year.

We'll see you at either the Fall Convention or LeadAc classes.

## Contest & Judging


Well, here it is, already time to think about the upcoming Convention. Have you made plans to attend the Sunshine's District Fall Convention? Are you planning on competing? I hope so – it should be a great time again in Orlando!

First, let me say a BIG congratulations to our two newest judges!! Paul Agnew and James Kastler were certified this past July at Category School. What a great addition to the Sunshine District! That makes 5 Judges in the SUN District. Paul Agnew, George Gipp, Steve Janes, James Kastler and David Mills are our 5 Sunshine District Judges. Unfortunately, Steve Jamison moved to Virginia so he is no longer counted as a Sunshine Judge.

Have you thought you might like to join the ranks? C&J is now accepting applications to start the three year process of becoming a judge. All applications for this current cycle must be received by December 15th, 2016! If you don't get your application in by December 15th, the next open period for applying won't be until July of 2019. If you don't think you have the singing and coaching skills to be a judge, have you thought about being a CA (Contest Administrator)? No music or coaching skills required. You need to be a good process engineer with good communications skills and not afraid of computers. Have you been a long time barbershopper and do you have project management experience? Maybe a CA is the place for you. We really need CA's in the Sunshine District so give it a thought. If you think you might be interested but you don't know what it requires, contact me and I will send you information and an application. Remember, this is open to ALL members and associate members (including women)!!

Big changes have taken place with the Youth Quartets at International. All youth quartets must qualify via Video – they no longer can qualify by singing in the spring at our Convention. That does not mean we can't have a Youth Quartet contest, it just means it won't be a qualifier for International. It will only be for whatever award the District would like to create, or they can register and compete for the big one at International.

### Steve Janes Contest & Judging



Speaking of spring, are you aware that starting next spring, the District Convention will be in early March? Every year? That means you have to start thinking about the Spring Convention almost immediately after the Fall Convention! Registration for competing quartets will begin by December 15th with the cutoff by the 10th of February. Wow!! Right during Christmas and the New Year – make sure to mark your calendar now so it doesn't get forgotten! You need to start to plan early. We did this so all you fair weather members (I think our term might be snow birds?) could participate in the Spring Convention before you head North. So lets make the Spring 2017 Convention one to remember!!

Are you aware that the Contest and Judging program has undergone a big change? The Presentation Category has changed to the Performance Category! Although this transition has been in the works for at least five years and some of the Performance values were already present in the old Presentation Category, it really is a new way of adjudicating your performance. You need to make sure you are up to date on all the changes by reading the C&J Manual on Performance, reading all the information that has/will be coming out on the changes via the BHS Web Site and Harmonizer and getting coached by those who are aware/up to date with the new Performance Category. I definitely would be disappointed to have any of the Sunshine competitors this fall saying "I didn't know about the changes". Do your due diligence now! I think you will really like the changes that reward real, heartfelt performances without the moves and choreography that distract from the message of the song. If you have questions and can't find information on the changes, let me know. I will be glad to point you toward resources that will help explain the changes.
