THE ANNUAL FILING REQUIREMENTS REAR AGAIN.

Congratulations to all our chapters and chapter leaders. All of the current leaders of Sunshine District Chapters have been entered into the Society web site. That's one thing we don't need to worry about until next year. BUT,

Secretaries and other chapter leaders--it is once again time to confirm your Florida state incorporation status renewal is complete. This must be done by May 1. If you find your chapter is deficient in this status, you can renew immediately online at http://www.sunbiz.org. If this function is normally done by the chapter Treasurer, then please confirm that it is complete. If you are late, your chapter may be required to pay a late fee to complete the transaction.

Caution:

Failure to submit the annual report by the deadline will result in the loss of Not-For-Profit Corporation Status and in the administrative dissolution of your corporation and you will no longer be recognized as an active chapter within the Barbershop Harmony Society.

A chapter that is not incorporated is not technically in compliance with the Society Bylaws, Statements of Policy, rules and regulations, and is not eligible to compete, have a vote in the House of Delegates meeting, register quartets as part of its chapter (which will affect their ability to compete also) or be covered under any of the Society's liability insurance coverage, and subjects the chapter president and officers to personal liability.

Another annual housekeeping function regards filing your taxes. Again, this applies to all chapter leaders and especially Treasurers. The 990s for fiscal year 2011 should be filed by May 16, 2012.

Instructions can be found at httml. AND once you have completed this, it is imperative that you log onto eBiz (https://ebiz.barbershop.org/ebusiness/) for your chapter and complete the "Financial Filings" entries for the fiscal year 2011.

We did well regarding payment of ASCAP fees for last year's performances—almost 100% compliant. The ASCAP fees, payable to the Barbershop Harmony Society, have changed once again for 2012. If your chapter grosses less than \$51,111.11 in ticket sales for ALL performance(s) during the year 2012, you will be required to submit an ASCAP reporting form with a check for the minimum amount of \$230.00. Last year the annual minimum fee to ASCAP was \$222. Make your check payable to the Barbershop Harmony Society, and send it directly to me with your BMI/SESAC Show fees. This process applies to 95% of our chapters. Keep in mind the annual minimum fee is just that—an annual fee, not a per show fee. BMI/SESAC licensing is no joke. We pride ourselves in being able to show our friends and family all the hard work we put into learning our craft. However, if your chorus fails to submit a BMI/SESAC for show clearance, your time and effort could end up behind locked doors. That's not the worst of it. If you fail to obtain proper show clearance, you may not be properly covered for insurance purposes. So, check, double check, and triple check that you have that show clearance on hand the day of your performance.

On a sad note folks, I have the unpleasant task of announcing that Chapter P-041, Suwannee Valley has turned in their charter. We wish them well on future efforts.

I look forward to seeing all of you at our next convention.

By now, all the chapter treasurers should have sent out 1099-Misc if they paid anyone over \$600 without expense receipts. If you haven't done so, get it done quickly.

You should now be working on your Federal tax return that is due on 5/15. Use either the 990t, EZ or 990 to file, send a copy to Nashville either electronically or by mail and record when you filed on Ebiz. If you were at any of the Leadership Academy sessions, you know how to do it. Please file timely. As I told the attendees at LeadAc, 4 chapters in this district have lost their non-profit status for failure to file with the IRS for 3 years or more. You don't want to know what it will cost you in time and money to get your non-profit status back.

The liability insurance policy is available on the BHS website under documents. You can download it from there.

We are into a new fiscal year for the district and are doing fine for now. Please support all district activities (conventions, Sizzle, Harmony Explosion, LeadAc, and Labor Day Jamboree) if you are able.

If you ever have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact me. I know we have a number of new chapter treasurers in the district. I and others who are knowledgeable are available to help, you just need to ask.

We will see you in Punta Gorda for the spring contest.

Let's Talk Craft - Vowel Matching

Question: When does 2 + 2 = 5? Answer: When barbershop harmony is sung correctly, creating harmonic overtones and "expanded sound."

One of the most important factors in the achievement of choral blend and expanded sound is unity of vowel sounds. Vowels are what we sing and sustain, separated by consonants to make words. When we match vowel sounds, we create like harmonics and the sound expands in intensity through reinforcement. In singing, vowels are created through the natural resonance of the human vocal tract. The tongue, lips and jaw are used to fashion the resonators into their vowel shapes. Some basic rules to follow when forming vowel sounds are:

- > When producing all vowel sounds, the tip of the tongue should be placed gently on the lower gum ridge, with the tip barely touching the base of the lower teeth. This helps keep the throat open so the vocal chords can vibrate naturally through the resonators (mouth, throat, and sinus cavities).
- > The jaw should be allowed to relax naturally with a swinging down and back motion.
- > The lips should leave the teeth uncovered.
- > Although the mouth must be open wide, it is not how wide it is open but the shape that is most important.

Every vowel can be sung with one of three mouth shapes: round (example—"oh"), square (example— "ih" as in sit) and oblong (example—"ah" as in pop). Refinements to form each specific vowel sound are made by the degree to which the tongue is arched in the mouth, and the degree to which the jaw is dropped. For instance, both the "oh" sound and the "oo" (as in moon) sound are made with the round mouth shape, but the "oh" sound is made with the mouth as open as possible while the "oo" sound is made with the smallest, most rounded shape.

As we sing the songs in our repertoire, keep in mind the basic mechanics of producing vowel sounds and think about the target vowel sound for each word in the song. Properly matched vowels can enable our chorus of 20-something men to "fill the hall" and create the expanded sound that makes barbershop harmony so much fun to sing and hear.

By the time you receive the Sunburst and have read this article, we will be only a few short weeks until our spring contest in Punta Gorda. Your convention team hopes that all of you attend this contest weekend to compete in a quartet or chorus and to hear the best quartets and choruses that the district has to offer.

This spring we changed our contest entry deadline from two weeks prior to the contest to four weeks prior to the contest. Giving us two more weeks to do what we have to do hopefully will eliminate last minute communication errors.

This spring's chorus contest will have a change. We no longer will have chorus plateaus. We will be replacing the plateau system with awards for choruses who show a grade level improvement over the grade level score from the last time they competed in a spring contest. Naturally, only those choruses who show a grade level improvement will be recognized and given an award. We also will be recognizing the chorus who has the most point improvement over the last time they have competed in a spring contest.

\$7,000 Presented to Penny Mecklenburg! by Tom Rooney

Our 2011 Annual Show, *Heroes in Harmony*, had two major goals: to put on a quality show for our audience, and to contribute a significant amount of money to the John Mecklenburg Fund. Both of these goals were certainly exceeded!

After the tragic death of Deputy John Mecklenburg on July 3, 2011, his widow Penny wanted to keep a low profile and not be in the public eye. But when she learned of our special show and the continuing success of the cash contribution program, she decided to attend the show as our guest, along with her 6-year old son, Andy.

As we know, the show was a smashing success! More than 600 people attended, and the Program Ad sales were twice as much as last year. This resulted in net proceeds of around \$4,600. Adding the cash contributions of over \$2,300, this allowed us to contribute \$7,000 to Penny Mecklenburg and her children. Although we didn't specify a dollar goal, none of us on the Show Committee expected we would do this well.

On November 30, 2011, we held a check presentation ceremony hosted by Sheriff Al Nienhuis. Attending were George Williamson, Doug Stewart, Allen Magnus, and myself – and of course, Penny Mecklenburg. Jean Hayes of the Tampa Bay Times covered the ceremony. Penny was overwhelmed not only with the contribution, but the show itself. She never expected it would be this "grand".

We Hernando Harmonizers should be justly proud of this accomplishment. This was by far the biggest single contribution in our history, and it certainly

Imagine what it would be like to hear someone singing something <u>you</u> created......and imagine how the lady with you would feel.



Bill Austin, 80, passed away Jan. 12, 2012 in Orlando, FL. Bill was born July 25, 1931 in Jacksonville, FL to George

W. and Vennie Ergle Austin. He was very proud to be a fourth generation Floridian. Bill attended the University of Florida (1949-1952). He was a veteran of the US Marines during the Korean era.

In 1955, Bill began his career with F. W. Woolworth, moving frequently from 1955-1968; repeating his childhood moves of 13 cities. He re-settled back in Orlando in 1978 with his 5 & 10's store until he joined the family business (Louis C. Herring & Co., Inc.) in 1980 which he operated until 2000. Mid-Winter BHS Society Board meeting Tucson, AZ January 19-20, 2012

The Tucson Mid-Winter Convention lived up to its billing with a rousing youth chorus festival, a strong Senior Quartet competition, and evening shows from the best quartets in the world of barbershopping. Despite the low attendance, less than desirable sleeping arrangements at the headquarters hotel, and cool temperatures, everyone thoroughly enjoyed this reunion of our barbershop family and were enthralled with the grand style of barbershop harmony and brotherhood that we have become known for over the last 75 years.

The Society Board spent Tuesday evening and most of Wednesday during the convention week discussing and interviewing potential Society CEO candidates. There is no doubt that the SBOD knows what we are truly looking for in a new CEO but are still in the process of finding that individual to take over the reins of the Society. We have seen a number of very talented, dedicated, and personable men involve themselves in the CEO search process, but we are still looking for the man we feel will take our Society to the next level of growth and musical excellence. In a word, the CEO search is still ongoing and in process. You will know when we know when the next CEO is found.

The board meeting agenda was not overwhelming this time and allowed time for discussion on some very important pressing issues and ongoing programs. Due to the absence of some Operations and Committee leaders and a lack of several current reports, a number of issues were tabled until the spring board meeting in Nashville. Here are some of the more memorable subjects that were covered during our meetings:

• Interim CEO Larry Deters updated the board on where we stood financially, numerically, and how the Portland convention was shaping up. No adjustments in the current budget were needed at this time. As of January 5th the Society membership stood at 24,229 with a goal of 24,787 to be reached by year's end. The number of chapters stands at 794 with a goal of 803 during 2012. With 26 weeks to go before the Portland International Convention, registrations stood at 2093 with a goal

of 5260 to be reached. As of January 1st at least 88% of the Society chapters had been visited by District and Society leadership. The reaction to this program has been quite positive and we are just now beginning to reap the benefits of all the collected data.

- Director of Society Operations, Rick Spencer, and Harold Hill guru, Keith Eckhardt, brought the board up-to-date on the Harold Hill Program Society-wide. The Harold Hills are now in place, the website along with a training program for Harold Hills, put together by Paul Wietlisbach, Becca Box, and Keith Eckhardt, is in place. And the website, www.operationharoldhill. com, is continually being updated. The Society BOD volunteered each of its members to serve as a Harold Hill for the remainder of the year. The goal is to add 3200 new Society members in 2012. The number of Society chapter participants is growing daily.
- CFO Heather Verble and Society Treasurer Dwayne Cooper reported that in 2011 the Society had a positive net gain with lower than expected revenues and even lower than expected expenses. The Society headquarters building has been successfully remortgaged at a lower set interest rate for the next ten years. The Management Financial Task Force is continuing its work to help streamline the cash flows and investments of Harmony Foundation International and the BHS. This will eliminate much confusion in determining the financial status of both linked organizations. The Program Fund is being reviewed for an appropriate name change that more accurately describes its use by the Society and the current value of such fund.
- Larry Deters will be reporting later this spring on the Society's plan to increase the public's awareness of the BHS. Two additional items have been added to the Society

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Work Plan. These are the Harmonizer and the Marketing Initiative.

- There will also be a task force recommendation forthcoming dealing with the regulations concerning small chapters and charter revocation. Currently, the Society is depending on districts to report the need for such revocations for chapters that are non-existent or cannot operate due to lack of viable membership numbers.
- Concerns about the current lack of Information Technology, hiring is being assessed by both the SBOD and the Society office. Much work has yet to be done to fully utilize the eBiz system currently in place. Lack of available budgeting has delayed the addition of much needed IT staff.
- The District Harmony Marketplace process was reviewed by Rick Spencer and Larry Deters and changes have been made to help more Districts with the ease of ordering merchandise, returning merchandise, and improving the opportunity for increased income to the districts.
- An update on the American Harmony movie

- and subsequent public advertising was delivered. A viewing of the movie will be shown on television and copies of the American Harmony DVD are being marketed and sold in a number of public venues.
- Becca Box reviewed the latest Society program to help make the dues collection process for incoming members more user friendly and easier to understand by both chapters and applicants. The new program still did not answer some of the confusion that is plaguing many chapters and the program was not approved by a majority vote.

Hopefully, this will give you an insight into the workings of your Society Board and its desire to provide our membership with every opportunity for growth and increasing musical excellence and enjoyment. The resources available are immense. Please feel free to contact me or any members of the Society Board or the Society office if we can be of further service to your district/chapter leadership or membership.
