





### **DISTRICT BUSINESS**

Broken Record Time—No, not the historical Olympic or Guinness World record kind, but the kind where information is repeated time after time after time. Bet you can even tell what's coming.

First: It is time for all chapters to start organizing and assigning members to a chapter nominating committee to select officers for next year. Too early? Don't think so. If you don't start now, by the time you follow all the rules for nominating and electing, it might be too late. By the way, regarding elections, hope you voted in the primary and are planning to vote in November. The Chapter elections are not the only Barbershop selection that occur at this time of year—the District is putting together the slate of District officers for next year so if you are interested in any of the District board positions, please contact Keith Hopkins and he will give you the information on the duties of the position and how you can make your desires known.

Second: There are STILL several chapters in the District who are in arrears when it comes to reporting the legal status of the chapters to the Society and this is for 2011. This refers to the tax required 990, the requirement to update the chapter's incorporation as a non-profit with the State of Florida and the REQUIREMENT to perform an annual financial review of the chapter records. OK so you have done all that stuff BUT now that the initial stuff is done, if you are the chapter secretary and/ or treasurer, you still MUST report the fact to the Society. How you say? Well sign on the Society web site, and then members only. Go to "MY MEM-BERSHIPS", click on your chapter and when your chapter downloads, you will see "Financial Filings" in the tool bar. Open that up and LO! There are the sections that need to be updated. By the way, all this and more really important information that a chapter secretary or treasurer needs to know is presented at the Leadership Academy (LEADAC) that the District holds each year. Information regarding the LEADAC can be found in this publication under an article prepared by Dave Roberts.

Here is the bottom line(s)

- (1) The Society has rules and regulations,
- (2) The rules and regulations are binding on all chapters and Districts,
  - (3) The current rules and regulations can be

found in the Society Rules and Regulations Handbook, on the Society web site,

- (4) <u>All</u> chapter and District leaders have an obligation to their chapter, the District and the Society to be familiar with the rules and regulations, and at least to have read the R&R Handbook so as to be aware, at least, that there are Society rules and regulations out there which with the chapter or District must comply, and
- (5) All chapter and District officers should attend LEADAC every year. I can guarantee you will learn something(s) you need to know in order to be a more effective chapter/District leader.

Third: You can't change the legal name of your chapter without first requesting the name change from the District and Society. Remember, chapter leaders may change the name of the CHORUS at any time without the approval of the District or the Society. However, Society governing rules that bind the chapter clearly require approval of a corporate name change (that is the legal name of the Chapter) by both the District and the Society, and these rules require that the chapter's "Society name" and the chapter's "corporate name" be the same (the "official name"). This is clearly outlined in Sections 3.04(c) and 16.01 of the Society Bylaws, and Sections III.A (3) and III.G (1) and (2) of the Society's Chapter License and Charter Policy. OK? So, you may change the chorus name to whatever you like but you may not change the CHAPTER's name unless you get permission by way of the procedures noted above.

Fourth: The last scratch in this record refers to the House of Delegates meetings that are held twice a year at our conventions. At the last HOD meeting, we had a record (good record) attendance of 39 attendees from 27 chapters. That's 73% of the chapters represented. Remember, the HOD is the meeting where YOU have the opportunity to agree or disagree with the policies that the incumbent board of directors has put in place. If your chapter is not represented, then you have relinquished your vote. Don't lose that right.

### **Chapter Happenings**

Tallahassee's Capital Chordsmen Generate a Heatwave of Harmony Spring, Summer, and Fall 2012

The **Capital Chordsmen** rang in another hot spring and summer of song in 2012. A half-dozen of our quartets sang on Valentine's Day. More than 75 **Sweetheart Serenades** for spouses, parents, bosses, and significant others in the Capital City area. Each quartet delivered a song, a tag, a heart-shaped box of chocolates, a carnation, and a souvenir digital photo of the event to their "victims."

On March 31, a stalwart Chordsmen crew strolled down Monroe Street and serenaded the 100,000-plus attendees attending Tallahassee's annual Springtime Parade. Talk about exposure! That night, we performed our third annual Quartet Extravaganza at the acoustically inviting and audience-intimate Tallahassee Little Theatre. In-A-Chord, Revised Edition (our women's quartet), The Rolling Tones, Venus and Mars (two women and two men), and an outstanding high school quartet from the Florida Panhandle, The Accidentals, performed a heady package of love songs, traditional barbershop, pop, and gospel numbers. We tagged the evening with a wine and cheese after-glow in the lobby.



The Extravaganza proved to be a timely tune-up for our June 9 matinee and evening **Annual Harmony Show** at Tallahassee Community College. Our theme was **Everything Old Is New Again**, a showcase of four periods of American music—from the "good old days" early in the 20<sup>th</sup> century through the 1930s, the '60s, and the contemporary music of our own era. Our audiences lingered "Down by the Old Millstream" and drifted "Up a Lazy River"; immersed themselves in "The Still of the Night"; remembered "Yesterday" with The Beatles; and, finally, jived with Michael Jackson

and testified to "The Way You Make Me Feel." Chapter quartets **Stevie J and the Kids**, **Revised Edition**, **The Rolling Tones**, **In-A-Chord**, and **Venus and Mars** laced the show with their songs and routines.

Our guest quartet for the 2012 summer show was our own bass and expert arranger **Jackson Pinder** and **The Vigilantes**, International Silver Medalists in the 2011 Kansas City Collegiate Quartet contest. The Vigilantes wowed our audiences with the variety, creativity, and power of their show package.

At the July 2012 International Convention in Portland, our indefatigable Director, **Greg Hilliard**, and the **T.H.X.** chorus placed 13<sup>th</sup>, and The Vigilantes scored quite respectably, too, in their first-ever wide-open quartet competition.



On August 1 and 2, at the annual **Bandwagon** political candidates' forum sponsored by WFSU-TV, our chapter's **VLQ** sang tags and patriotic songs to keep the area politicians on time and honest (well . . .) as the politicos gave their pitches—but certainly not the barbershop kind! Chapter President **Steve Jacobsen** directed us at these appearances. We'll also be serenading—and prompting—the candidates and their supporters at the second round of Bandwagon events in October.

To change the tune a bit, this August and September The Capital Chordsmen and designated quartets are performing **This World Is Not My Home** at the Woodville United Methodist Church, south of Tallahassee, and at the Chaires United Methodist Church. This makes our third year of producing gospel outreach shows for community churches.

### **THX returns from Portland!**

Wow! That's all we can say about the International experience and our trip to Portland.

For many of our members, this was their first time attending an International convention, even as a spectator. Couple that with the opportunity of a lifetime being a competitor on the greatest stage a barbershopper could ever dream of singing on, topped off by a 13th place finish and you have memories to last the rest of our lives.

Our sincerest congratulations to the *Big O* on another wonderful International performance, and representation. Who would have ever thought two choruses from Sunshine would be in the Top 20 in the world! You've been an inspiration to us for so many years.



As a quick recap: we had 56 members on stage ranging in age from 9 (Brock Stratton) to 82 (Charles Duran, don't tell him because he acts 45!). We had a newly pinned 50-year member (Roy Eckert), two father son(s) combinations (Aaron & Brock Stratton and Aaron & Scott & Shannon Elswick). We also had three sets of brothers (Aaron & Scott Elswick, Buddy & Tim Stewart and Alex & Dan Rubin).

There were six members who competed in the International quartet competition (Paul Saca from *A Mighty Wind*, Travis Murray & Scot Gregg from *17 Below* and Aaron Stratton, Dan Rubin & Alex Rubin from *Throwback*). And to top that off, we only had seven rehearsals between Fall Convention and International; a truly special bunch of committed singers.




We're a huge (and growing!) family. Since the start, that's been the most important thing to us. We focus on allowing our members to grow their individual skills while always keeping an eye on our journey ahead. Since forming in August 2011, our goals have been to create an experience that never stops challenging our members and to keep moving forward. Longtime barbershopper and member of the Greater Canaveral Chapter, Phil Hansen, died on June 19th after a too short battle with cancer. At the time of his death, Phil was both Chapter President and Chorus Director of the Greater Canaveral Chapter.

Although Phil did not join the Society until 1964, his barbershopping roots go back to the late 1940s. Phil's dad was the brewmaster for Kingsbury Breweries in Wisconsin. Kingsbury was owned by O. H. (King) Cole, one of the early Presidents of the Barbershop Harmony Society. Cole's daughter, Jinny Cole Osborn, founded the great ladies quartet, The Chordettes. Phil literally spent hours watching The Chordettes rehearse and perform before they went to New York City to become regulars on The Arthur Godfrey Show in 1949.

Phil's only barbershop chapter was the Greater Canaveral Chapter where he was a member for 49 years. During that time, he served as the Chorus Director of the Space Coast Chorus on four separate occasions, most recently from

1995 until his death. The Space Coast Chorus twice placed second in Sunshine District Chorus Competition under his direction. At various times, he also served in every Chapter Vice President position and was a four time Chapter President. He was Chapter BOTY on five separate occasions.



Phil also sang in six registered quartets...the last being 4-Notes. His greatest quartet thrill was singing bass, for fourteen years, with the 1949 International Champion Mid States Four. Singing with the Mid States allowed Phil to become an Associate Member of the Association of International Champions (AIC). He became active in the AIC by managing the popular "Sing With The Champs" at the annual Society International Conventions.

At the District level, Phil was an Area Counselor and quartet and chorus coach.

Phil is survived by Sue, his wife of 32 years, one brother, three sons, one daughter, ten grandchildren and the many barbershoppers who sang with and for him.

My last recollection of **Phil Hansen** was this last February when the Melbourne and Canaveral chapters presented a joint chapter show "Circus Day in Dixie". At one of the last combined rehearsals, Phil was there sitting at a table in the front of the chorus taking charge of the group. You could tell that he was not well, but doing what he could to help with scripting the show. And the day of the show, he was singing in his quartet and directing some of the songs as best as he could with some of the Space Coast Chorus members assisting him. You could tell there was nowhere else that he wanted to be, a true barbershopper to the end. We will all miss him and his passion for our craft. Ed.

The SBOD had the opportunity to interview these three men on Monday morning. We were all most impressed with the backgrounds and integrity of these men. In the end, we felt that Marty Monson was the man we had been searching for these many months. He is very energetic, always thinking up new ideas, looking ahead, and excited about the challenge of heading up the Barbershop Harmony Society. We look forward to working with Marty in the coming months and are confident that positive change will be in store for our Society.

The SBOD is also happy to announce that **Gerry Borden (EVG)** and **David Calland (JAD)** were voted onto the Society Board for three year terms beginning January, 1, 2013. Rick Ashford and Jim Sams (yours truly) will complete service on the Board effective December 31 to make room for these fine men to contribute to the ongoing work of the Society.

Roger Lewis, Chairman of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee, reported on many of the events that will be taking place in Toronto, Canada in July 2013. Needless to say, it is an event none of us will want to miss! In addition, the Mid-Winter Convention being held in Orlando, FL in January 2013 may tout having the largest Youth Chorus Festival ever with upwards of THIRTY choruses! If you have never seen one of these festivals you will definitely want to be there!

Pete Carentz and "Montana Jack" Fitzpatrick presented an impressive ongoing study of providing a complete barbershop track for introduction into our nation's home schooling programs! Can you even begin to imagine what the impact a program of this magnitude could potentially have on the future of our Society? We will continue to monitor this potential program and I'm sure you will be hearing much more about this in coming months!

We also heard a very rousing address from the moderator of our District Presidents, Mike Ott, about the ongoing goals of District Presidents and our Operations Teams. The DP's and the SBOD are working more closely now than ever before. Together we are looking forward to having CEO Marty Monson on board to help formulate ideas and solutions for chapter membership growth and even greater enjoyment of barbershop harmony throughout our Society. We have some very strong leadership within the DP Council and are looking forward to another great year!

The Board voted to extend the time frame for small chapters' (less than eight members) charter revocation to a total of NINE MONTHS! This will give our districts a THREE MONTH period to try and prevent chapter suspension (loss of voting privileges and chorus competition) and an additional SIX MONTHS following suspension to assist small chapters in getting their numbers back to EIGHT or more to prevent charter revocation. The District Presidents and members of their Leadership Teams will be notified on a monthly basis as to where their Chapters In Distress are and give them adequate time to help these chapters recover, if at all possible. However, at the end of this NINE MONTH period, if numbers are not above eight, chapter revocation is automatic. So PLEASE begin working with your small chapters in hopes of helping to breathe new life into their programs.

The Society CFO, **Heather Verble**, and Society Treasurer, **Dwayne Cooper**, and Harmony Foundation International CEO, **Clarke Caldwell**, are unanimous in their feeling that the financial future *Continued on page 11* 

### Contest & Judging

Our fall contest in Punta Gorda is fast approaching. As a reminder to all quartets and choruses, the cutoff date for entry into the contest is Friday, September 7<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 PM. Any late entries will be considered but not guaranteed. If you know that you are going to compete, then enter the contest via the Society's website. The initial draw for singing order will be held the following Monday and contestants will be advised via email. Requests for changing singing position will be considered for documented, valid reasons.

We have a very solid and experienced judging panel for our contest. The panel names are listed on our District Website. They will come to the contest prepared to hear/watch your performance, give you the score you deserve and then in the evaluation sessions, discuss where you can improve. Quartets will have sufficient time in the evaluations to be coached.

Our Society Contest and Judging Committee is recommending that choruses be provided 20 minute coaching /evaluation sessions starting this fall. We wanted to offer  $3 \times 20$  minute coaching sessions for choruses, but due to physical space limitations at the convention center and hotels, we cannot offer this. There will be  $3 \times 10$  minute sessions for each

chorus. Next year when we return to the Orlando Marriott Airport Hotel, we have plenty of space for chorus coaching/evaluations.

In July, 2013, our judges and contest administrators category school will be held. Selected certified men and selected candidate men will be invited to this school in anticipation that they will pass the school and become certified for the next three years. There are some excellent candidates with superb talents that is causing the bar to be raised to gain/ retain certified status. This fall we will have six candidates as guest judges/contest administrators in the judging area. So if you are in contact with one of these gentlemen during the contest weekend, give them a handshake and make them feel welcome to our district. FYI, candidates expenses are not covered by districts or the society. If you feel so inclined to make a contribution towards their travel expenses, just give me your contribution and I will see that it gets distributed accordingly.

If you would like to make application to be a judge or CA candidate in the fall of 2013, contact me and I will provide all the pertinent administrative things that you must do. The Sunshine District only has four certified judges/contest administrators, the next to the last district in quantity. It would be nice to have a few more men represent the Sunshine District in the contest and judging fraternity.

See you in Punta Gorda. I will be busy with my official duties, but I can always find time to sing a tag or a song, so tap me on the shoulder.



Keep in mind that at this point in time less than 15% of the Society membership is signed up with any of these programs. That means that more than 85% are doing very little to ensure the future of this Society. Just ask yourself if you feel that the future of barbershop harmony is worth investing money in.

Another Task Force, the Global Strategy Task Force, has been reinstituted to work even more closely with our Affiliates around the world. There is much work to be done as we stretch our arms across the oceans and around the globe to keep the whole world singing!

The Mixed Harmony Affiliate Task Force is thinking seriously about inviting mixed quartets and VLQ's to look into what the BHS might be able to do for them and possibly introduce another potential affiliate to our Society. We've only begun to uncover the potential of this exciting opportunity. Who know what doors these mixed groups might open to promote growth, not only in our Society, but also to the a cappella world around us.

The SCJC is continuing to work through plans to address the financial problems a few districts are having in putting on two contests a year to choose *Continued on page 14* 

### SUNSHINE DISTRICT HALL OF FAME

Induction into the Sunshine District Hall of Fame is the most prestigious recognition that the District can give to those individuals who have made exceptional contributions that have enhanced the barbershopping experience in the Sunshine District.

Any recipient of the award must have been a member of the Barbershop Harmony Society for 25 years and active within the Sunshine District for 15 years. There should also be a universal recognition, within the district, of the recipient's contributions.

The Sunshine District Hall of Fame Committee, comprised of past living Hall of Fame recipients, is responsible for the selection of new members into the Hall. Each year, they have the option of selecting one, multiple or no nominees. Formal induction into the Hall of Fame is made at the Sunshine District Fall Convention.

The award was created by the Sunshine District Board and approved by the House of Delegates in 1983. The first recipient was Sam Breedon.

Jack was a long-time Board member and Baritone Section Leader with the **Daytona Metro Chapter**.

Jack's name has been placed on the "Keep a Melody Ringing" Memorial, and he has been memorialized in the Barbershop Harmony Society and Harmony Foundation headquarters' office in Nashville, Tennessee. There are actually three boards in a row like the one shown below, where the name plates are attached. Jack's name is on the third board in the left hand corner.

Jack loved the sweet sounds of barbershop harmony and the Barbershop Harmony Society. Before he passed, he was honored by the Daytona Beach Surfside Chorus as "Barbershopper of the Year"! He was often referred to as "The Singing Trooper" since he served as a Maryland State Trooper for a period of time. Jack was also the original Baritone of Daytona's own Surftones quartet, until his death in 2009, one of the Daytona Chapter's premier quartets, who sang for three Governors from West Virginia to Florida and did more than 200 shows and 300 Singing Valentines over their eight years of active service and won several awards for performing and his wife, Dotty, was their manager and booking agent. We miss him.




"This event introduced me well to barbershop. It gave me greater insight & appreciation for the interactions between parts. I also learned more about my head voice, its limits, and how to improve it."

Harold Allen Schoff 1915 - 2012 By Ken Schoff

Harold Allen Schoff, was born on December the 1st, 1915 in Canaan, VT. His parents were Emmaline Platt and Rev. Allen Schoff. He had two younger sisters – Marion and Florence.

My father met my mother – Ruth Evelyn Williams - at the 1st Methodist Church of Ansonia, CT. They were married on July 26, 1941. They raised two children - Carol and myself. We moved from Ansonia to Cheshire, CT, in 1960.

My father graduated from the University of Vermont with a degree in Electrical Engineering. He got a job with the American Brass Company Research Labs in Ansonia. CT.

Harold was active in the S.P.E.B.S.Q.S.A. for over 59 years. I remember attending a national convention in Boston in the '60's with groups singing in the hotel lobby and hallways until 2 and 3 in the morning. In the summer in Cheshire, we sometimes had a Barbershop chorus cook-out in our back yard. We made it a point to invite all the neighbors since we knew there would be songs well after midnight. For several years on Christmas mornings, I went with my father and the Silver City Chorus from Meriden, CT, to sing at the local hospitals.

When my mother died, Dad moved from

Arizona to Melbourne, FL, to live near my sister, Carol. He immediately became active with the local Harbor City Harmonizers Barbershop chorus and became part of the quartet named 'Senior Moments'. He also got involved as a mentor to a local high school student, Adam Bothwell, which he really enjoyed.

When my father was 90, he had to give up tennis because he broke his leg in a fall while playing volley ball. (Think about that statement.) Harold took up tennis late in life. He did this because it was less expensive than golf.

My father died on June 1, 2012 at the age of 96 and 1/2 - exact to the day. On the day before he died, when he was in the ICU at the Melbourne Wuesthoff hospital, my sister leaned over his bed and told him that if he wanted to go and see Mom, that would be OK. He responded with his characteristic humor and said, "I'm in no hurry."

I shall miss my father. I am sad that he is gone. But then - when someone lives for 96 and 1/2 years - perhaps there is some cause for celebration.

Harold was not only an asset to our chapter but an inspiration. He preferred to stand on the risers while others would sit. You could always count on Harold to make our singouts and shows. He signed up to go out into the community to do singing valentines. Harold was also a salesman for the chapter and went to the local merchants to secure sponsors for our show program. Ed.



As directors, we have a really interesting job. We're conductors. We're teachers. We're motivators, voice instructors, planners, project managers, artists, visionaries, recruiters, occasionally disciplinarians, and always relationship builders. We're leaders... and often, as boards and chapter presidents move through their terms, we're in our leadership position longer than anyone else. (After all, the director position usually doesn't have a one-year term.) And, we're balancers. We balance our vision with the vision of the chapter/chorus.

How can we be more effective in our job? One way is to help develop the musical leaders in our chapters. Many of our chapters are using the "Compellingly Attractive Chapter Meeting" format, which creates member involvement, and offers more people leadership roles in the chapter meeting. Outstanding in Front can help you develop your musical leadership.

"Outstanding in Front" (OiF) is a day-long workshop, taught by Society trained clinicians, targeted

toward developing musical leadership in our chapters. It's targeted toward our section leaders, assistant directors, Music VPs, tag teachers, warm-up directors, guys who like to direct Barberpole Cat songs... These guys are our musical leaders, regardless of title.

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
