MORE REMINDERS

Seems like the only thing my articles contain are reminders about deadlines and requirements but, I guess that I need to do that to keep us all legal with the government and the rules of the Society. But first, some congratulations to all the Chapter Secretaries: Great news that all officers of all our Sunshine Chapters have been entered into eBiz. Now we just have to remember to keep all that information correct. Hey! Has anyone moved since the last input of information?

SESAC/BMI:

Well I guess it's good news there is no increase in the fees we need to pay when we register our shows. You all are doing a good job in sending me the forms and correct fees. Of course you all know the BMI Show Clearance Applications should be filed before finalizing show venue and guest quartet contracts. This is to help alleviate the possibility of chapters in close proximity to one another from having shows on the same weekend. Should such an occasion arise, the earliest cleared show will usually control the date. In any case...no show clearance, no show. Thanks

ASCAP

Of course there had to be something new in this area. I sent out the 2014 ASCAP forms last week to all Chapter Secretaries, Treasurers and Presidents. Good news is that the minimum ASCAP fees for 2014 have gone up only a couple of bucks from \$235 to \$237. HOWEVER, (and this is critically important) the ceiling for GROSS revenue to which the minimum applies has been reduced from \$51,111.11 to \$29,625.00. This means the gross ticket sales required to reach the minimum decreases over \$20,000. While this may impact a few of our chapters, it will affect some, especially those doing more than one show a year or those whose admission charges are higher. So, be aware of You may be required to submit a larger this. ASCAP fee.

Remember that the ASCAP fee is a yearly fee based on the gross receipts from performances your chapter has produced and for which you sold tickets. If you do not have a show, you do not need to pay the annual fee.

To make life a little easier, you might want to hold

off sending your payment until close to the end of the year. AND remember at present, all ASCAP and SESAC/BMI payments must be sent through the District Secretary (me). Here again is my address:

State Incorporations:

Have you filed your Florida State Not For Profit incorporation documentation yet? Now is the time to do it!!. All filings are due at the same time—May 1, 2014. Sounds like a long time away but time has a way of sneaking up on you.

Taxes, Taxes, Taxes:

Don't be one of the chapters that run up against the tax issue next year. Plan now to get all your financial records ready to file your 2013 form 990 on time.

Financial Review

There is one other "business" type requirement that has been somewhat ignored, and that is the Financial Review. Ten, that's right, ten of our chapters, are still delinquent in that requirement either for last year or for a number of previous years. And delinquency in any of the requirements puts the chapter in jeopardy of incurring penalties including disqualification from competition. You can check to see if your chapter is in this category by simply going to the chapter financial records on eBiz, If you have questions or need assistance, let me know.

Registration for the Spring 2014 District Convention

That means that the only method for registration will be through the District Website. It is very easy and should present few problems. Remember that like most computer usage, what you put in is what you get out. If you choose to use all lower case lettering that is how your name badge will appear. If you leave out your Chapter or Quartet, it will not miraculously show up on your badge. Please enter a nick-name, or preferred name, as that will be the heading for your badge.

The Chorus Director Development (CDD) Committee has several programs to help our directors become the best they can be. Last Fall, Lance Lubin, Associate Director of the Greater Pinellas Chapter, cleared his final hurdle to earn the title "Certified Director". To become a certified director in the Barbershop Harmony Society takes most applicants several years. Applicants, through courses offered at Harmony University, District schools, and self study, must show proficiency in conducting skills, music theory, vocal production, teaching skills, and leadership.



Lance has worked for several years to make it through the Certified Director curriculum. He is a self-described "come up through the ranks amateur director". He's a musician, performer, guitar player and mandolin picker, whose prior musical

experience centered around bluegrass music. Prior to getting hooked on Barbershop, he didn't have any conducting experience. But through years of study, under the likes of Joe Cerutti, Kirk Young, Royce Ferguson, Don Campbell and Steve Armstrong at Director's College, and plenty of work learning the music theory that a director needs, he completed the last of his requirements last fall.

On completing a Chorus Director's Workshop Intensive (CDWI) hosted by the Gainesville Chapter, his final requirement, Lance said, "Wow! Absolutely fantastic." As a director, he says, "it is imperative to get outside coaching. ...(you) must have outside help to improve." As a real estate broker, he's required to take continuing education courses each year. What an incredible blessing it would be if Directors...could be exposed to this sort of coaching on an ongoing basis. This CDWI really allowed me to clear that final hurdle with stripping away the extraneous junk in my directing.

Congratulations, Lance. Mastering the Certified Director curriculum is an achievement to be proud of. We're looking forward to many great things from you and your chapter!

For those competing, remember there are numerous choices – make sure you select everything that applies to your quartet or chorus: Spring Quartet Prelims (selecting Quartets to compete at International in Las Vegas), Seniors District championship, District Chorus championship, Collegiate Quartet Prelims (selecting quartets to compete in the College Quartet contest at International in Las Vegas) and finally, a VLQ District champion.

The Sunshine District is fortunate to have four certified judges including the category specialist in the Singing Category. But we are especially excited to have three (3!) new applicants from the Sunshine District. Just starting their judging experience are Alex Rubin, Paul Agnew and James Kastler. Upon completion of their pre-tests, we expect them to be invited to school this summer and if they are successful, they will officially become candidates. The Sunshine District is grateful to have three well-qualified applicants and is looking forward to all of them being certified in the summer of 2016. Make sure to congratulate these individuals when you see them around the District!

If you ever thought about becoming a judge, contact the VP of Contest and Judging to express your interest. The next candidate cycle begins in January of 2017 and applications have to be submitted with all letters of recommendation before December 31, 2016. It is not too early to start making plans. The judging program is looking for well-rounded

individuals that are very active in Barbershop with experience in directing and/or coaching and singing.

This Spring Convention, we will have four quartets from out of district competing on the stage in Orlando. Because of work/wedding conflicts with their own District Conventions, they have requested to sing at the Sunshine Prelims in May. This in no way affects our District quartets except for the possibility of making it a more exciting convention. One of the out of district quartets is "Lunch Break" and if you haven't seen their comedy routines before, you are in for a treat. In any case, we will have our normal 10 District finalists on Saturday night and if any of the four out of District quartets qualify for the finals, they wll be added to those ten quartets. Since the only thing that qualifies quartets to go on to International is their score (not placement), it has no effect on how many Sunshine District quartets are on the stage Saturday night! Wouldn't that be a treat!! This is something you don't want to miss.

Here are a couple more reminders of what kind of information and requirements are (or were) due.

FEBRUARY

President

Send the name of the chapter delegate to the House of Delegates meeting at the Spring Convention to the District Secretary. The submission must be in writing for it to be authorized. Email is acceptable.

Secretary

Record the name of the delegate to the Spring HOD in your chapter board minutes.

Treasurer

IRS Forms 1098/1099 are due to the IRS and to anyone your chapter pays (director, etc) by February 28th of each year.

MARCH

President

Plan on attending the HOD meeting. Oversee completion of required legal documentation.

Secretary

Verify chapter's incorporation status and prepare documentation in preparation for May deadline.

Hope to see you at the Spring Convention.



The Sunshine District will conduct another VLQ (Very Large Quartet) contest at the Spring (2014) convention in Orlando with the following conditions and parameters. Please note the changes in section d.

- a. A VLQ shall consist of five to eleven singers.
- b. All singers shall be members of the Sunshine District, although not necessarily the same chapter.
- c. Each singer shall possess an all-events pass.
- d. A SUN VLQ may include no more than 50% of its members who are members of any current registered quartet. IE: in a VLO of 8 members, 4 may belong to a registered quartet; in a VLQ of 9, 4 may belong to a registered quartet; 10, 5; 11, 5; etc

Ed: This will hopefully open small ensemble opportunities for new and/or inexperienced singers to be part of a fairly competitively even contest.

e. The VLQ contest shall be conducted as part of the chorus contest, and shall be included in the draw for Order of appearance.

Ed: An opportunity to perform to a larger audience.

- VLQs shall compete in one of three categories
 - i. Youth (26 and under),
 - ii. Senior (55 and older),
 - iii. Regular (everyone else)

with champions in each category.

- g. All members of a VLO competing in the "Youth" and "Senior" classifications shall meet the age restrictions for that category in order to qualify for competition.
- h. VLQs competing in the "Regular" category may consist of a mix of age group singers.
- The competition set shall consist of two songs selected by the VLQ which meet the Society Standards for i. Barbershop competition.
- A VLQ shall enroll in the contest via the Society Website.
- k. The official judging panel assigned to judge the convention contest will score a VLQ using the same judging standards used for quartets and choruses.
- 1. Champions shall be determined for each competition category.

- m. A Scoring Summary shall be created listing all of the VLQ's and their scores. This would only be a Sunshine District report.
- n. There would be no formal evaluation schedules for the VLQs. However a VLQ would have the option of contacting the scoring judges post contest and ask for a written evaluation of their performance.

Editorial from my perspective as the A: <u>Chapter Development (Membership) VP for the Sunshine District</u> and from my perspective as B: <u>Music Director for the Martin-St.Lucie Mariners</u>.

A:

- Smaller chapters might now have a chance to perform at a convention in a contest.
- If we continue to next Fall, the concept will provide a focus opportunity for chapters which suffer from snowbird depletion in the Summer months.
- What an inter-chapter opportunity!
- What an opportunity for a chapter to sponsor a youth ensemble from a local school!
 Think about it.

B:

- It'll create some focus for the Summer months.
- It'll allow me to sing facing the audience.
- It'll give coaching opportunities for other members of the chapter.
- We'll treat VLQ's like quartets and allow them the opportunity to perform in front of the chapter, with the understanding that VLQ rehearsals will be separate from the chapter meeting.


