# TIME AGAIN FOR ANNUAL FILING REQUIREMENTS... AGAIN!!!!

Let me first take the time to thank the Chapters that have taken the time to keep their chapter legal and off the radar. This helps make my job as well as those at International easier; and for that we are grateful. Unfortunately there are still many chapters which are delinquent in several areas and I would ask that each of you go to your eBiz website and check your financial filings status to verify you have indeed met all requirements to date.

With that said, here again is a reminder of what needs to be done to maintain the legitimacy of the chapter. The filing for nonprofit corporation status, the filing of the tax report for last year, ensuring the paperwork for solicitation is done, the completion of the financial review for last year.

Here is a list of items that need to be addressed annually by all chapters in the Sunshine District:

#### **State Incorporations:**

This should have been done by May 1. Even if your chapter has completed the State registration and paid the money for the incorporations, that fact still needs to be documented with the Society in the eBiz section of the chapter. This needs to be completed to meet Society requirements.

#### Taxes, Taxes, Taxes:

Another annual housekeeping function regards filing your taxes. Again, this applies to all chapter leaders and especially Treasurers, but chapter Secretaries can help by reminding the Treasurers. The 990s for fiscal year 2016 should have been filed by May 15, 2017. Upon completion, this also needs to be updated on eBiz.. all chapters not filing and updating this information will be delinquent after May 15th.

#### Solicitation:

In Florida, all not-for-profit entities that collect donations from the public are required to register. This helps the State to regulate and prove the legal status of the entity. If you are not sure if your chapter is up to date, you can visit the SunBiz website at http://search.sunbiz.org/Inquiry/CorporationSearch/ByName and check your

chapters status. If you need help, you can contact me at secretary@sunshinedistrict.org and I will be more then happy to assist.

#### **Listing Chapter Officers:**

Did you know if you have someone filling a job that is not on the list, you might be able to get that job title added if you ask? If you are in that situation, let me know and I will help you. Also, please make sure that throughout the year you keep the list updated as people on the board may change midyear for whatever reason.

#### **Financial Review:**

This is the area where we are most lacking and it should not be because it is easy to do. Chapter Treasurers need to take a look at the Treasurer's manual and see what needs to be done. There is even a suggested form that can be used. This is not an audit but the form or report needs to be sent to Headquarters and the date of the review needs to be annotated in eBiz. All others, not completing and updating eBiz, will be delinquent after May 15th.

#### **BOARD AND HOD MINUTES**

Did you know the minutes from the Board of Directors and the House of Delegates meetings are posted on the Document section of the Sunshine District web site under Services:

https://www.sunshinedistrict.org/services/ I would strongly suggest you take a look at the minutes to get an idea of how hard the board has been working to make the Sunshine District the best in the Society. In the minutes, you will see lists of action items that the board members are working on and if you have an opinion regarding one of the items, let the point of contact know. As a matter of fact, the Minutes from this past Spring Convention House of Delegate meeting are now uploaded and available for viewing on the Sunshine District web site. ### Financial Review -Has your Chapter done one lately?

Elsewhere in this issue our District Secretary, Brian Wunderlin, gives reminders about several items that need to be accomplished to keep your chapter in compliance with various requirements. One requirement that is frequently overlooked is the Financial Review. As Brian says: "This is the area where we are most lacking and it should not be because it is easy to do." Less than half of the chapters in the Sunshine District have completed this task in the past year.

The Financial Review is relatively simple and is NOT an "audit". It is simply a validation process to ensure that the financial information maintained by the Treasurer is accurate. It also provides the Board of Directors insight into how the actual chapter expenditures match up with the budget. You don't need a CPA or financial analyst to perform the review. Anyone who can balance a

checkbook should be able to do the review. The recommendation from BHS is that it should be performed by one or two individuals who are not part of the Chapter or District Board of Directors. When complete, the Chapter Treasurer or Secretary needs to enter the date of completion in EBiz under chapter financial filings.

A detailed explanation is available on the BHS website, in the Documents section, under Chapter and District Business Tools

This is something the Board and BHS will need to work on if we intend to continue to want Youth participation at our Conventions. Don't forget, the Fall District Convention has also changed dates and will be in late October from now on. This year it is October 27/28! And a new award has been approved by the Sunshine Board. There will now be an award for the Most Improved Quartet at the District Quartet contest. Many other Districts have such an award and the Sunshine Board wants to encourage District Quartets to stay together and work to always improve. Hopefully, this award will encourage quartets to do just that.
