Naples/Ft. Myers Chapter

Ready, Set, Sing

Early in the spring of 2018, I read an article in the *Harmonizer* magazine promoting a community outreach project titled Ready, Set, Sing. The idea was to offer a series of free vocal workshops to area residents who love to sing and who would like to understand the basics of proper vocal production better.

The article mentioned that the Sound of the Rockies had undertaken the project with great success. I contacted Mark Palmer their Membership Vice President who was more than happy to share their experiences. I then shared this information with our Chapter Board and was given the go-ahead and a generous budget to promote the project locally.



Dr. Taylor Ferranti, Associate Professor of Music at Ave Maria University

We decided to hire Dr. Taylor Ferranti, an Associate Professor of Music at Ave Maria University, to conduct the classes. Dr.

Ferranti is well

known in the Naples community and offers both individual and group voice lessons, in addition to his teaching role at the University.

We advertised the project in both a daily and weekly news publication for six weeks prior to the first session. We also utilized social media and email announcements via Constant Contact. The return on our investment of time and money far exceeded our expectations.

The first of the six sessions was held on our regular Thursday rehearsal night, October 11. We were pleased to welcome 66 members of the public of which 40% were male and 60% female.

Guests began arriving at 6:45 PM. A team of chapter members signed them in, gave them a brochure containing a welcome letter, a summary of the six sessions, and a picture and bio of the instructor. The class began promptly at 7:15 and concluded at 8:30. Following a 15 minute break, guests were invited to remain to observe our regular rehearsal.

As our guests departed, they were given sheet music and learning tracks to the Leonard Cohen arrangement of Hallelujah, which will be used for demonstration purposes beginning in session # 3. A followup email was sent to all attendees encouraging them to complete the series.

This project is purely a public service offered by our Naples/Ft. Myers Chapter and we were careful not to mention membership, although we certainly hope that some of our guests will want to know more about the Barbershop Harmony Society and us.

It is contemplated that this might become an annual event in which other members of the Sunshine District may wish to participate. p.s. October 26-27. A number of Miamians' members (including its director, Alex) who are also members of THX, a competing chorus (The Miamians consider itself a performing and non-competing chorus), saddled up and attended the fall Sunshine District Convention in Orlando while other members donned their halloween garb and participated with the BeetlejuiceVLQ In Key West at Fantasy Fest 2018 spreading the barbershop sound throughout the attending throngs.

November 18. Members of the BeetlejuiceVLQ

entertained the crowds at the DeLand Fall Festival in DeLand Florida, a huge arts and crafts juried event, where they were dubbed "walking singing works of art." Ok, that was weird. But fun.

December 1, 7, 8, 9, 12, 15(2), 16, and 22. Christmas Concerts. Yep, you read it correctly. The Miamians have and will continue to perform at local churches, stores, retirement homes and parks at 9 separate venues ranging from Cutler Bay in south Dade County to Pompano Beach in northern Broward. Audiences have given rave reviews for the concerts performed as of this writing and one must feel assured that the appreciation will continue. The Christmas spirit is alive and well swelling toward Christmas Day and receiving substantial impetus from the beloved melodies (and some never heard before ((and possibly never again)) offered by the inspired voices of The Miamians.

October, November and December. "And above all this bustle you hear" the Miami Music Medics (quartets from The Miamians) dressed in scrubs and entering various hospitals in South Florida bringing smiles and some holiday cheer to those children in need of medical attention who would much rather be in their warm beds at home.

There are so many opportunities to spread good will and cheer through sharing this amazing hobby we all love with others this holiday season. As a barbershopper, you have the potential, so just do it. "Voices singing, let's be jolly, deck the halls"! Yule be glad you did.

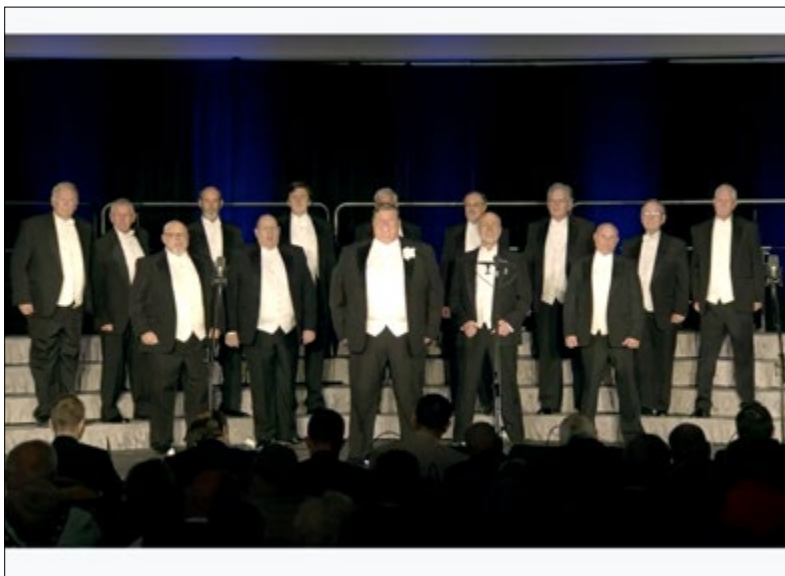
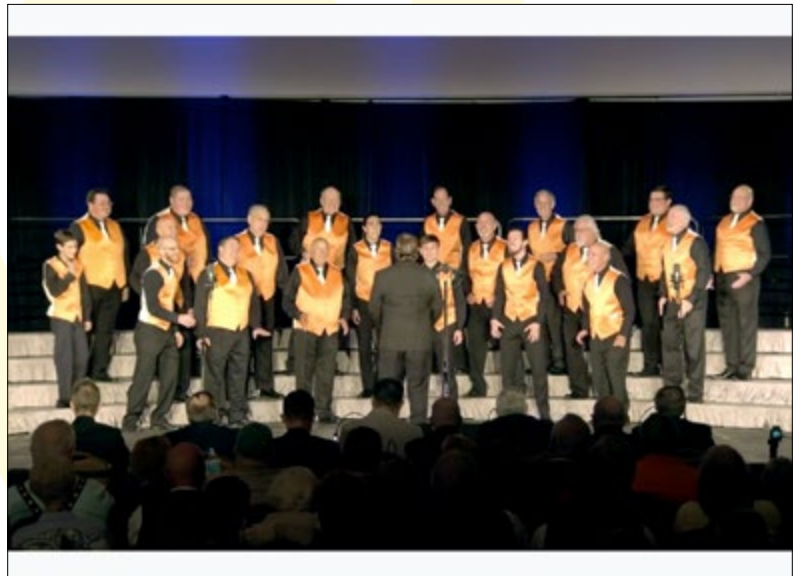

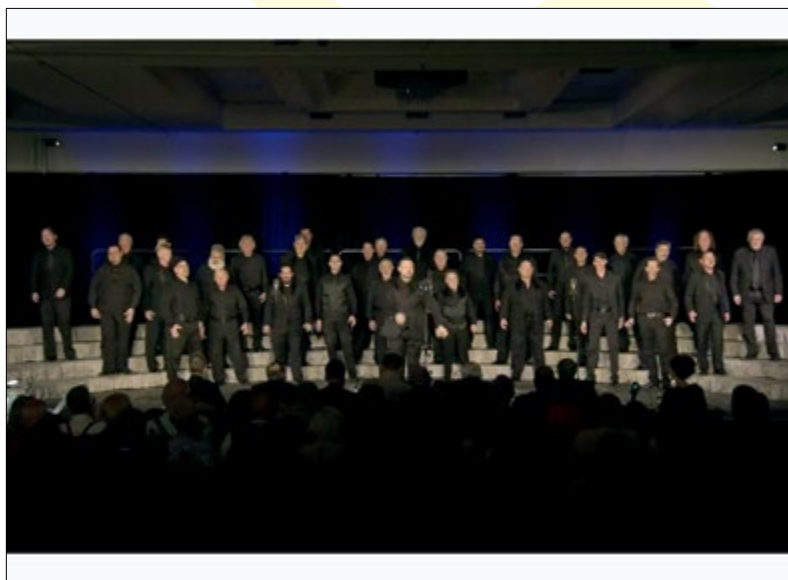
