The facility was wonderful, and while attendance was lacking, our competitors were top-notch. We hope that there will be greater participation in the Spring of 2023. For those that attended, please encourage your peers to attend in Spring - this is the lifeblood of the District and we throw a great Convention!

I must acknowledge the SUN Board of Directors as I leave office. You are only as good as the people around you, and our incredible Board stayed intact for the better part of my term. You have a very capable and servanthearted Board here in SUN. They will step up and tackle issues when needed, and each Board Member cares deeply for the betterment of the District.

I will still be around and deeply involved as Immediate Past President. You are in very capable hands with Bruce Checca taking over as President, and David Mills as Executive VP.

The Move to Sunshine

There are few things as stressful as moving across the country for work. There are even fewer things as stressful as moving across the country and the job you moved for and the area you moved to were both far less than ideal for what you were looking for. That's where my wife Christine and I were about a year ago when we moved from Vancouver, Washington to a town just south of Ocala, Florida.

After changing jobs and moving a handful of times, we finally settled in beautiful Lakeland, Florida, in February of this year and had the foundation in which to build the life we envisioned for us when we decided to move from our home out west. A huge part of our lives, and the reason we met, is barbershop! We knew we needed to plug into the legendary Sunshine District!

One interesting part about our move to Florida is the fact that we didn't really know anyone, we don't have family out here, and we weren't super familiar with the state. But as we all know; where there's barbershoppers, there's family! One person I was familiar with was Matthew Boutwell, the bass of SUN's 2019 champ Bourbon Brothers Quartet and long-time director of the Orange Blossom Chorus. Matthew and I were friends on Facebook before we moved to Florida, because when you see a person online with enough mutual friends who are all barbershoppers, you send a request!

After messaging back and forth, Matthew invited Christine and I to the Sentimental Journeymen Annual Show on April 3rd, which his awesome quartet headlined. We heard the first live barbershop music in three years and it started a fire in our bellies. Matthew and I met for lunch five days later to get to know each other and talk 'shop.' At that lunch, we discussed maybe trying out a mixed quartet. He had talked about mixed harmony previously. Matthew hadn't done anything mixed before, though he was willing to try it out. Christine and I had been very lucky to experience the awesomeness that is the



Evergreen District where we had been doing mixed singing for years and always looking for opportunities to sing with each other.

Fast forward to June 5th where Matthew and Gayle made the trek from Altamonte Springs to Lakeland to sing some tags and try out the sound. After a few hours and getting to know each other and testing out some configurations, we decided we liked the product enough to schedule our first official rehearsal with the expectation of learning a few songs that we could really work on when we got to rehearsal. On July 16th, we rehearsed for hours and decided we liked how we worked together and this was the official inception of Party Central - a quartet of 4 people from Central Florida who liked to Party. Not "party" in the traditional way, but we like tag parties, dinner parties, introvert parties (sorry, you're not invited), or taking a map and calling it a party.

Once we talked about the future of the quartet, it became quickly apparent that the four of us were highly motivated by competition. We wanted to compete at the Sunshine District Competition as

a quartet in October. That left us only a few short months to find and prepare four songs to a level that we were comfortable showcasing, find an identity (we hadn't picked our name out yet at that point), find coaches. and gather the trust in each other on and off the stage. What would that take? For us, we decided that almost every rehearsal was going to 6–8 hours since we could only rehearse every 2–3 weeks as our schedules would allow as well as texting different ideas for every aspect of our quartet. It was a lot of work, but it's a labor of love for the craft.

October proved to be eventful in both planned and unplanned ways. In late September/early October, we had a major issue with one of our four songs that led to us needing to pick a replacement, purchase it legally, and work on it to get it to the level of the other three. We ended up adding extra 6–8 hour rehearsals in early October to make up for the late song addition. Right around this time, Christine lost her voice because of her new-ish job where she had to do more talking than usual. Gayle and I also had some vocal fatigue the week of contest. Part of our pre-contest plan was to have performances for Gayle and Matthew's choruses, which ended up being productive and helpful, despite some vocal issues.

Then contest weekend was here. This was the first district contest for three of us. We had crafted the identity we wanted, had songs that we loved to sing, and were continuously learning to be a cohesive unit. We were singing 10th. We were as ready as we could be. I was nervous, but in the best kind of way. We were going to show SUN what we had to offer. More than that, I wanted to show SUN who Christine and I were as the new folks in town.

On Friday, we sang our semi-finals package and it truly was one of the best nights of my life. I felt like our first song came together in a way that it hadn't before. It felt like a tight execution. Our second song was particularly emotional for me. The song was "When I Leave The World Behind." We had



Then, after what felt like an eternity, Saturday night finally came. I was amped to get to sing again for such a warm audience, on a great stage, and with people I love. It really felt like home to be singing barbershop, and I know we were particularly excited to sing our final song "Many Tears Ago" since few people had sung it and we had a lot of fun singing the awesome arrangement.

Then it happened...we were awarded 3rd place in the District! We are still incredibly honored for this distinction. Beyond this though, I am grateful and thankful to my core to be on this journey through life with Christine. She is my everything and one of the greatest joys of my life is getting to sing barbershop with her and share her with the world.

Thank you, individuals of the Sunshine District, for making our first SUN district convention phenomenally special.

Mr. Yu began singing with the Chordsmen in the spring of 2021. Normally singing tenor, he has assisted the chorus directors by helping other voices solidify their parts. He participated in the Chordsmen's Annual Holiday show in 2021.

- He purchased and sang the most long-distance Valentine Serenade in the entire Barbershop Harmony world, singing with a quartet to his sweetheart in Hong Kong, from the Tallahassee Senior Center—a distance of 8,586 miles.
- At the Experience Asia 2022 Festival, he coached our barbershop quartet (Half-Step Up) in singing a Cantonese traditional song, with a twist: They sang it in the Cantonese language.

About the Scholarship:

The Anton-Caraway Scholarship is a \$1000 award, founded by endowment from two members of the Chordsmen. Divided into two payments and given in the fall and spring semesters, funds may be used for any purpose the student wishes. Students can attend any course of study and must maintain good standing in chorus rehearsals and activities.

The scholarship itself is named for two late members of the Chordsmen. Fred Anton and Don Carraway were devoted members of the Chordsmen and lifelong lovers of barbershop music. Both were avid supporters, committed patrons, and tenacious recruiters of new talent. The legacies of both men are united and bound to the Chordsmen through this unique scholarship. The scholarship fund receives continued funding financed by tips, contributions, and donations from dedicated fans of the Chordsmen and their Barbershop Harmony music style.
