### **Director of Finance Message**

As most of you heard at the Fall contest, we have an endowment! With the recent donation from the Breedon fund, the endowment has reached its initial funding goal. This is exciting news for the Sunshine District as it sets us up with income – forever. This is also something you can do for your own chapter. At least one chapter in the Sunshine District already has its own endowment. You may be asking "what is an endowment and how does it work?"

#### What is an endowment?

An endowment is a fund of donations, typically held permanently, that is invested to generate income. The principal of the fund is preserved, while a portion of the earnings is used to provide long-term support for a specific purpose.

### How does it work in general?

**Donations** – Individuals or groups donate to the fund.

Investment - The donated principal (also known as the "corpus") is invested in things like stocks and bonds. This is typically done by a management group that oversees the

endowment.

**Spending** – a portion of the investment earnings is withdrawn annually to fund the organization, while the principal remains intact (you can never spend the principal/corpus – it can only grow and/or earn interest).

**Donor Intent** – Donors can specify how their donated funds should be used, such as for youth activities, scholarships, or other specific programs, or they can leave it up to the organization's governing board to decide.

### How does the Sunshine District's endowment work?

Basically, we had a donor in the past who donated a large sum of money (\$15,000) to an endowment for the Sunshine District. Harmony Foundation International (HFI) is managing the endowment for the Sunshine District – for free. They can manage your endowment for free as well. As the manager of the endowment, HFI will collect the donations, ensure that the endowment is properly invested and manage the spending/draws as well as the donor intent.

To start an endowment with HFI, there is a minimum threshold to be invested: \$25,000. You can save it up for a few years with fundraising campaigns, etc. Once you reach the minimum threshold of \$25,000, the fund will officially become an endowment and be invested to grow. It will take 2-3 years of initial investing before you can draw from the growth, but typically you can get 4-5% annually from the endowment. So, for a new \$25,000 minimum, you would receive \$1,000 - \$1,250 annually - forever!

You should encourage more donors to continue to grow the endowment for more income every year. Folks can set up regular donations, onetime donations, donations from their estate, etc. With successful fundraising over the years, your endowment could easily grow to \$250,000 (or more) and be providing you with \$10,000 - \$12,500 income every year at that size. Quite often the annual investment could exceed the amount you are drawing out every year, and the excess would be reinvested, continuing to grow the corpus.

As the manager, HFI would ensure that you



know what % of the funds are designated to specific uses by the donor's intent. For example, if \$15,000 was donated with no direction, then the organization can spend it however they want. If an additional \$10,000 was donated for youth activities, then HFI will let you know that on a \$1000 draw, you must use \$400 for youth activities, and you can use the remaining \$600 for general use. This ensures that the wishes of the donors are upheld year after year.

An endowment can ensure that a chapter can continue existence for generations. This could pay for a director's position, annual youth camps, leadership training, competition costs, performance costs like risers and uniforms, etc. The possibilities are endless – and so is the income, unlike grants that vary in value and can dry up in some years.

### Venice Chapter Florida Gondoliers

#### Interesting Barbershop cost details.

We are losing potential members because they say the dues is to high. The initial amount makes it look worse than it really is. Because in our chapter when you look at it per week, it's only \$ 5.09 per week. Where can you find any other type of entertainment as low as \$5.09 a week. One of our norther snowbird members says that's barely two cups of coffee. And I say it's a lot less expensive than going to bar to sing Karaoke.

If you are a new member under 75 years of age a combination of international dues. District dues, and chapter dues equals \$265.00 per year. Divided by 52 weeks in a year = \$5.09 per week.

If you are a member over the age of 75 you get a discount down to \$213.00 per year. Or only \$4.10 per week.

Now, I'm paying almost nothing because I have more than 50 years of membership in the society.

So if someone complains to you about the price of barber-shopping you need to compare it to the weekly amount similar to what I showed you here. The average person you will be speaking with will spend more money than this per week just on junk food or mics. nothings.

Add this to your arsenal of sales talk. It just might turn a potential member into a full active member.

Note: These numbers may vary slightly due to other districts and chapter dues amounts.

That show will be Sunday December 14th at 3pm at Sun City Center United Methodist Church.

Students were treated to world-class instruction led by two internationally renowned clinicians, **Melody** and **Clay Hine**, who brought their energy, expertise, and heartfelt love for the barbershop art form to Fort Myers. The teaching quartet, **Tonal Fusion**, provided both inspiration and guidance, modeling the unique blend of precision and fun that makes our hobby so special.

Over the course of the day, the students experienced the thrill of four-part harmony—learning tags, ensemble techniques, and the magic of locking and ringing chords together. For many, it was their very first taste of barbershop singing, and the excitement was contagious. By the end of the day, the massed chorus of 115 young voices brought down the house with a showcase performance that filled the auditorium with energy and applause.

"I'm so glad that this workshop was successful," said organizer Tara Shah, reflecting on the day. "I wanted my classmates and friends from across the county to feel what I felt when I first sang barbershop—how fun it is, how welcoming the community is, and how powerful the music can be when we sing together. I'm thankful that the HFI grant helped make this event happen."

Events like this underscore the vital role youth outreach plays in the future of our Society. Thanks to partnerships between Harmony Foundation International, local chapters like the Gulfcoast Harmonizers, and visionary young leaders like Tara, the barbershop style continues to reach new ears and hearts.


